Slot Jackpot Identification Requirements

Federal regulations require that Coushatta Casino Resort obtain a guest's identification for any slot jackpot win of \$1200 or more.

US Citizens – Form W2G

Any United States citizen who wins a slot jackpot of \$1200 or more must provide <u>two</u> forms of identification. At least one form of the identification presented must be a photo identification. Only valid, government issued identification will be accepted. Identification that is expired, altered or damaged is <u>not</u> considered valid and will not be accepted. A jackpot winner must also provide a valid Social Security Number.

Examples of acceptable photo identification:

- State issued driver's license or identification card
- State issued concealed carry handgun permit
- United States passport
- United States military identification (with photo)

Examples of acceptable second identification:

- United States issued Social Security Card
- Form W9

Failure to provide appropriate identification and/or a valid Social Security Number will result in the slot jackpot being held in safekeeping until the guest can provide acceptable identification.

Non-US Citizen – Form 1042S

Any Non-United States citizen who wins a slot jackpot of \$1200 or more must provide <u>two</u> forms of identification. At least one form of the identification presented must be a photo identification. The second form of identification must show proof of jackpot winner's nationality. One form of identification will be accepted if it satisfies both requirements of photo identification and proof of nationality, such as a passport issued by a foreign country. Identification that is expired, altered or damaged is <u>not</u> considered valid and will not be accepted.

Failure to provide appropriate identification will result in the slot jackpot being held in safekeeping until the guest can provide acceptable identification.

Coushatta Casino Resort does <u>not</u> accept photos, photocopies or digital/electronic versions of identification for jackpot payments.
